Flooding and Damage on Deeside etc.

Unless you have been on the Space Station with Tim Peake, you will not have failed to notice on the news, and indeed on the ground, the terrible end of 2015 and start of 2016 on Royal Deeside. There was also flooding at Aboyne, Inverurie and Ellon, and even Aberdeen was practically cut off for a time with both rail lines closed, and a hole appearing in the airport runway!

When a dyke along the golf course gave way on 30th December, Ballater was hit by a deluge of water which caused serious flooding in the centre of the village, and on the outskirts there was the sight of caravans from the local site floating down the river heading for Aberdeen. Clearing up is now the order of the day (or weeks, probably).

A section of the road to Braemar from Ballater was washed away, and until a replacement is in place the only way to get further west is via the B974 South Deeside Road. Allied to this, there is damage to Invercauld Bridge which has meant no vehicular traffic can go beyond it. This, and loss of power which meant cooking on the wood-fuel stove, caused issues for those staying at Muir at New Year, and the journey home meant a trip via Perth. When the A93 Glenshee road was later closed by flooding, then by snow, Braemar became unreachable by road.

Thankfully, Muir Cottage itself was unaffected by the high water levels but there will be a loss of income from those who were, and are, booked to stay at Muir in the

future. There has been to date little information coming in about possible damage to bridges and footpaths in the mountains themselves, but this will become clearer as the weather improves and it becomes possible to journey into the Cairngorms. Surprisingly, it seems that most of the usual huts and bridges (e.g. at Derry Lodge) have escaped damage; perhaps snow higher uphill limited the flow of water.

One piece of news has come from the Lochnagar Day meet in January. There was no option of a walk around Loch Muick (without a wade) as the bridges at the west end of the loch have been washed away. Also opposite Glas-Allt Shiel a landslip has covered part of the south side footpath. More information on these and any other problems in the hills, when available, will be posted on the Club Forum.

BMC Insurance

In July 2015, Club Member Ian Baxter reported difficulties in getting Fogg Travel Insurance Services (acting for BMC underwriters ProSight) to reimburse irrecoverable expenses for a trip to Nepal cancelled on FCO advice. After two refusals of his claim for "*reasons that were entirely incomprehensible to me as I suspect they were designed to be*", he had to threaten referral to the Financial Ombudsman Service before payment was made. Ian wrote to BMC suggesting that they (and not Fogg TIS) should contact all those who might have been put off by the claims procedure.

Night Hike

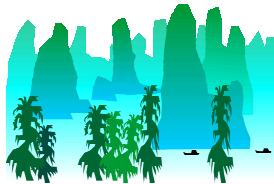
