Verwall Alps (Six-Day Hut-to-Hut Tour in Austria) Summer 2018

Club member Derek Beverley is planning a meet to the Austrian Alps scheduled for late July/early August. It is open to all members who have a love of high places and enjoy adventure. If you've never visited Austria before or wish to try hut touring, this meet may be for you. Six days walking with 5 nights at mountain huts are planned. The party will depart Innsbruck Mon 30 Jul 2018 and return mid-afternoon Sat 04 Aug 2018. The walking will be on paths some sections of which have wires for security. We'll be below glacier level but expect patches of old (or new) snow. A typical day (up and over a 2700mtr col) will be around 6hrs duration and the trip is best described as moderately strenuous. If you are a fairly regular mountain-goer, then you should be fine. Budget-wise you'll need to get to Innsbruck first (Derek can advise on flights/trains/buses). Once in the mountains, 50 Euros per 24 hours should be adequate to pay for what Huts provide: breakfasts, evening meals, coffees/soups/strudels/lunches, beers and often a packed lunch. Cairngorms National Park (CNP) Local Development Plan (LDP) 2020 Main Issues Report (MIR)

A jaundiced reviewer writes: "This snappy title applies to a 122-page document - PDF online, fully of glossy photos, and impossible to "use" - from the CNP Authority. It is accompanied by 770 pages of detailed "Site Assessment Reports" running from Aviemore to Invercauld, and ushers in the second of five stages leading up to the next LDP (which will dominate planning applications from 2020 onwards) via six "Main Issues", including Economic Development (the main focus of the Plan, though only part of the last of the Park's four statutory aims), Housing (e.g. the An Camus Mor "new town" proposed next to Aviemore, and sites proposed by developers at Braemar etc.), and (last) Land Management in Upland Areas. Club members may be puzzled and/or relieved that Inverey is nowhere mentioned; neither are hill paths or bothies (though one of the first photographs is a nice one of Corrour in snow). There are at least seven other CNPA "Strategies" and "Plans", e.g. for Tourism. The North East Mountain Trust, of which the Club is a member, has taken on the job of drafting a "response" to the LDP MIR "consultation" which ends on 2 March 2018. The MIR is available at http:// cairngorms.co.uk/consultation/mir/, and public meetings are scheduled on the 2nd (afternoon) and 6th (evening) of February at Ballater and Braemar respectively.

This winter (if the weather holds!) work should be started on restoring 532 hectares of degraded blanket bog, all on upland sites extending from 500 metres to 875 metres. The work is targeting eroded gullies, peat hags and areas of bare peat along with a small amount of moorland grips. The presence of Golden eagles on a number of sites is one of many issues that have required careful planning and discussion.

With financial support from Peatland Action (https://www.snh.scot/climate-change/taking-action/carbon-management/restoring-scotlands-peatlands/peatland-action-201718) there are five estates involved: Invercauld (photo 1), Glenfeshie (photo 2), Mar, Candacraig and Abernethy as well as a number of sporting tenants.





Garbh Choire Refuge Refurbishment

It is reported that the Mountain Bothies Association has been asked by the National Trust for Scotland, who run the Mar Lodge Estate, to renovate and maintain the refuge as part of their Eastern Highlands network, to be done in much the same way as the larger Fords of Avon shelter. The existing framework will be re-constructed in a back garden in Aberdeen, then taken to pieces, and taken up to the area, possibly by air. The existing shelter will be dismantled, the new one substituted, the same rocks piled on top again, and the remains removed, all in 2018.

The costs have been estimated at some £5000, towards which the MBA has received a substantial private contribution.

Statistical Patterns

Some research has revealed that Marj Ewan is the 7th female President out of the 44 Presidents (or Chairmen, as they were called at first) elected so far. Despite some war-time exceptions, they have served for an average of almost exactly 3 years each (the current "tradition"). There have been 14 Honorary Presidents (two female, including our current Hon. Pres., Dr Ruth Payne); they have served an average of 9 years each, though this figure is affected by the 33 years (1889-1922) served by the first incumbent, Viscount Bryce, and the 20 years (1922-42) by Professor Norman Collie. Save Bennachie Alliance

Members of the Save Bennachie group recently held talks with Economy Secretary Keith Brown and local MSPs at the Scottish Parliament. At it they outlined their concerns over the possible rerouting of the A96.

They handed the minister a new 18-page report detailing their argument why Bennachie, Aberdeenshire's iconic hill, should be saved from the new A96 dual carriageway.

Transport Scotland consultants are currently assessing the options for the eastern section of the £3billion road, with two of the potential routes passing close to the Bennachie Forest.

Aberdeenshire East MSP Gillian Martin arranged the meeting with Mr Brown to press the campaigners' case. Bob Smith, from Save Bennachie, said: "It was a very positive meeting, well supported by the north-east MSPs".
