Overnighter 2009

This year's midnight escapade will be to one of the finest but remotest mountain areas in Scotland. Current plans are to leave Aberdeen by minibus in mid-morning on Saturday 20 June, and drop folk off on the Dundonnell road, either for Loch a'Bhraoin (NH 162 761) or at Corriehallie (NH 113 849), and to pick up at the Kinlochewe road junction (NH 027 620) on Sunday 21 June shortly after mid-day, which should allow a reasonably early return to Aberdeen. It may also be possible to pick people up at Poolewe out to the west, to allow a direct trek through the Fisherfield Forest and/or its several summits (not described below).

Possible routes between these points are many, and choice will depend on weather (especially as regards stream crossings), desired objectives and personal capabilities. Campers and bivouackers may also wish to bear in mind the possible presence of The Midge.

Low-level routes via Lochivraon (bothy behind house at NH 117 735?) are over Bealach na Croise (NH 068 717), Bealach Gorm (NH 093 715) or Bealach na h-Imrich (NH 108 705) to reach a track to the Heights of Kinlochewe, or via Shenavall (or direct) up to Loch an Nid and Bealach Gorm. Another possible ex-Shenavall route (if the river is fordable) goes up Gleann na Muice and around or over Beinn Tarsuinn to Loch Fada, whence across stepping stones at the loch-foot and down Gleann Bianasdall to Loch Maree, or SE to the Heights.

Higher-level routes, taking in Munros and/or Corbetts, are equally numerous. The western Fannichs (Sgurr Breac and A'Chailleach) could be bagged before heading SW over lower ground to the Heights. Creag Rainich is an isolated Corbett (aren't they all?) between Lochivraon and Loch an Nid. Further west, the Munros Beinn a'Chlaidheimh and then Sgurr Ban, Mullach Coire Mhic Fhearchair and perhaps Beinn Tarsuinn would make a superb all-night route, before the long walk out.

The cost is yet to be fixed but should not exceed £20. Final details will be communicated to participants, and posted on the Forum and the website.

From the Club Library

"The Ascent of Yerupaja", by John Sack, 1954.

This is a wee gem of a book, partly in the style of the Rumdoodle classic, but ending with a real high-mountain crisis, frostbite and all. Yerupaja is Peru's second highest peak, the high-point of the Amazon River watershed, and near Siula Grande of Touching the Void fame. In 1950, it was the highest unclimbed summit outside Asia, and after the ascent (described here) in that year by a bunch of amateur U.S. university types, the next ascent, 16 years later, was by a couple of young up-and-comers, Reinhold Messner and Peter Habeler. The book, by a non-summitteer but a fine writer and later a notable journalist, covers the traumas of expedition preparation and mountain approach in light style, and then describes the final assault, which in some respects resembles the Void episode.


