## Willie Robb Bequest

After considering over 20 suggestions received from members on various occasions, the Club Committee is focussing on a small number of leading options for the use of Willie's bequest of £40,000. A sheet accompanying this issue of the Newsletter contains some information on these options, and further details can be found on the Forum – where comments can also be posted. To summarise here, Working Groups considered, with roughly estimated costs:

- A new footbridge at Derry Lodge, to reduce bog erosion by boot and bike (£30-40K); a bridge over the Geldie was considered but thought inadvisable
- A simple shelter (not a hut) and some woodland fencing at Altanour up Glen Ey (£4K + £10K)
- Improvements at Muir: apart from some minor items which can be met from normal Club funds, a new wooden shed to hold bikes and tools securely (£10K)
- A second Club hut in Glen Torridon, by conversion of an existing small stable block (£10K?).

Each of these options is thought to be feasible in 'engineering' terms, and the relevant permissions have mostly been obtained in principle. Possible co-funding from external (or internal) sources has been only partially investigated; this might allow all options to be pursued though it might also delay things.

At the medal ceremony it was pledged that one of the medals would be taken to the summit at the next opportunity and that nothing would be spared to make this happen. Unfortunately the 'Pledge' was lost to history. Kenton and long standing friend Rich Robinson unearthed the story and with superb support from Samsung we were able to bring closure to the massive achievements of the '22 expedition."

Planning permission has recently been secured for several key sections of the Speyside Way, which will be extended from Aviemore to Newtonmore. The whole route is expected to take around three to five years to complete, and to cost around £2 million

#### **CNPA News**

Five organisations (Highlands and Islands Enterprise, Forestry Commission Scotland, Cairngorms National Park Authority, Scottish Natural Heritage and Highland Council) have announced a new partnership to develop a coordinated management plan for the publicly owned land at Cairngorm Mountain & Estate and Glenmore Forest Park. They will work with private businesses and local communities to map out the future for this important place. A new masterplan will set out plans to deliver a world-class visitor experience, protect and enhance nature and landscape, and boost the tourism economy.

## Ptarmigan, Capercaillie, etc.

Diligent viewers of the Club's website will recall the 2006-2009 University of Stirling/ British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) Project Ptarmigan, which has now ended. However, an academic paper (Calladine and Wernham, in Avocetta 33: 217-224 (2009)) has recorded that "Encounter rates reported by volunteers were low (means of 0.25 birds and 0.34 'sites' per km - 'sites' being an encounter rate that included groups of faecal piles) but did not differ significantly from those achieved concurrently by experienced professional ornithologists undertaking monthly repeated surveys of transects for calibration purposes." However, volunteers reported "no birds" significantly less frequently! In succession to Project Ptarmigan, a new BTO project, 'What's Up?', is seeking volunteers for sightings and 'transects' above 750m: see http://www.bto.org/national-offices/scotland/our-work/whats-up

Justin Prigmore has been appointed by the Cairngorms National Park Authority as Capercaillie Framework Project Manager. The Framework will bring together, in a GIS-based map, existing knowledge on the state of capercaillie across the Park, pressures on the populations, and current management measures, and will result in a series of recommendations for future action.




