Talking and Traversing

On 6 September, the Club President and Secretary betook themselves to the Mountaineering Council of Scotland's Annual General Meeting and Gathering at Glenmore Lodge, enjoying (mostly) the trip through the Lairig an Laoigh, including a short section of recent path improvements up out of Glen Derry although the rest of that section over to the Fords of Avon remains as stony as ever.

The main bone of AGM contention was the proposal to raise the per capita subscription for members of clubs from £10.60 to £13.00, on the grounds of "unfairness" in comparison with individual MCofS members, who pay £27.30. The Club Committee in August had expressed unhappiness with this (the new figure equates to the Club's own subscription), but had given its representatives freedom to vote as they saw fit on the day. At the AGM, other reasons for the rise were mentioned by the MCofS Treasurer, i.e. the need to keep an Access and Conservation officer in post, and a 50p rise in the insurance premium. In the event, the Club's vote (of 40, a good deal less than "fairness" might suggest!) was exercised against the rise, but was outweighed by a substantial majority (of most other clubs, and individuals). The matter will, of course, be be considered (yet) again at Committee and perhaps the Club AGM in November.



Following the AGM, a rather different 75 minutes or so was spent hearing from Hugh Fullerton-Smith, general manager of the Alladale Wilderness Reserve, on the "fencing for wolves" controversy. An interesting chap, with experience in New Zealand (deer), Africa (lion?), Canada (bison), Mongolia (sheep) and Essex (wild boar), Hugh explained the estate's goals and activities to date (see www.alladale.com) in rather different terms from the recent BBC series, and responded gracefully to some punchy concerns over fencing. Others in the audience were more sympathetic to an estate (and its money, from the Lister family) clearly intending to be "different" from more traditional outfits.

On the Sunday, a rendezvous was arranged with the Club bus for the traverse back to the Linn o'Dee, this time over Macdhui under the supervision of Claire Marris, who guided her party unerringly through some dense mist and drizzle until views were obtained halfway down the Sron Riach. Others took a variety of routes, including the Lairig Ghru and the Shelter Stone/Etchachan, and everyone was back on time!

Project Ptarmigan

Some members will remember this 2006 exercise by the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO). A fuller report is on the Club website, but, in brief, the highest "encounter rates" (about 0.5 birds per km transect) were recorded in the Cairngorms, and the lowest in Argyll and the Trossachs. The data will help to establish trend patterns: the 2000 figure for Scotland is about 10,000 pairs. The main measurement problems are (i) distinguishing between ptarmigan and grouse droppings, (ii) both ptarmigan and walkers avoiding snow, and (iii) volunteers not reporting lack of sightings! A successor to the PP is Bird Atlas 2007-2011 project (see www.birdatlas.net), and all hillwalkers are invited to contribute with sightings, possibly after some "training".

Incorporating photographs into reports also requires registration with a commercial photo-hosting site such as Flickr or Photobucket.

At the time of writing (end-September) the Forum already has 44 registered Club members and over 100 messages. It is easy to post a new message by clicking "NewTopic" within the relevant section (e.g. Day Meets, News and Banter, etc.); you are then presented with a box and a mini-array of buttons for bold, font, etc.

The system does currently contain a variety of adverts (as do many other internet sites). The Committee is to discuss upgrading the forum to remove these.
