

Speyside Way Extension

The extension of the Speyside Way between Aviemore and Newtonmore is a step closer, with work due to start in the autumn on a bridge over the Allt na Criche burn on Kinrara Estate This will provide a largely off-road link between the two communities for the first time. The extension is expected to take 3 to 5 years to complete, and to cost around £2 million.

Mountain Paths (COAT)

Mid-2000s efforts having failed due to poor design and construction, a more "desirable" path leading up from the old Sinclair Hut site in the Lairig Ghru onto Braeriach's Sron na Lairige has recently been established, with many boulder steps on a couple of steep peaty stretches. Higher up, lighter-touch work has been done. Remote Accommodation System (RAS) cabins were used, as at Loch Avon in summer 2012, but, with all waste (general, recyclable and human) taken out, little trace should be left. The RAS will be used again at Loch Avon in summer 2014.

The Cairngorms Adopt-a-Path Scheme (CAPS) now (July 2013) has 17 trained volunteers covering 20 paths (60% of Priority 1 paths, 33% P2 and 20% P3): see News item on COAT website.

Currently, the following paths are available for adoption see (http://www.outdoorcairngorms.co.uk/upland-paths, under "Paths in the Scheme"), Sron Riach, Lairig an Laoigh, Ben a'Bhuird, Glen Derry, various Linn o'Dee paths. An evening meeting of current and potential adopters may be held this winter. A new COAT website is promised "shortly" – and not before time! At time of writing (Sept. 2013), not much "new" is apparent.
