Altanour Fencing

With funding of about £10,000 from Willie Robb's bequest to the Club, 950m of 2m-high deer fencing has now been completed at Altanour at the head of Glen Ey, at about GR 082 824, in two areas (see diagram, which superimposes approximate fence lines on old dyke lines). The work was done by Andrew Lovie of Logie Coldstone, who also erected many small enclosures along Glen Ey over the summer, for the EU-funded "Pearls in Peril" project. One of the Club fences at Altanour is around the 40-odd remaining larches between the landrover approach track and the river gorge to the south-east, plus some additional bare ground, with a small burn, to the southwest. The other is around a similarly-sized but roughly rectangular area of mostly bare ground (though once wooded, inside a dyke) to the northwest of the track. This area includes the lodge ruins - which was not planned, but ... !

There is a stile but not a gate into both areas. The Committee has approved some signage to record funding from the bequest, and to discourage folk from entering.

Further steps that might be taken include:

- Erect a simple shelter; though the fencing has cost somewhat more than originally estimated, and the ruins no longer provide an obvious (if unsafe?) location
- Fence against rabbits and (more likely) hares, as has been done at Piper's Wood (continued on page 2)

though not permanently effective (continued from page 1)

- Plant seedlings, possibly within individual tree guards, and/or ground preparation (scarifying) to encourage tree growth
- Shift the stiles to less obvious locations than on the trackside, so as not to encourage entry
- Install some bird boxes on the existing larches
- Carry out a baseline biological survey, as has been done for the Piper's Wood extension (see recent *CCJ*).

COAT/CAPS

The Cairngorm Outdoor Access Trust has drawn up its Operational Plan for 2015-2020. With less money around, there will be less effort going into new Community Paths around and between villages, and more emphasis on the use of existing paths. Mountain Paths, Training and Volunteering have been packaged up into The Mountains and the People, a £5m+ HLF-funded project for both the Scottish National Parks, with COAT having to open and staff an office in the Loch Lomond area. Nearer home, repairs have been done at Dubh Loch, Glittering Skellies and the Lochnagar 'plateau', and are scheduled for Jock's Road. The Speyside Way will be further extended from Kinraig to Kingussie. Last year's Bertha floods will require substantial rebuilding of many paths and bridges, well beyond the COAT resources available for maintenance. Carrbridge and Crathie will be the first to get repaired, and the others as soon as funds become available. The Adopt-a-Path Scheme (CAPS) is taking on "new" paths, replacing those on the NTS Mar Lodge Estate.

Macdhui Indicator

A longstanding Member has suggested that, in view of its deteriorating condition, this indicator – now 90 years old – be repaired or renewed: though it has stood up well to the Cairngorms climate, careless ice-axes have taken their toll. The Committee is expected to consider the matter (and perhaps the Lochnagar indicator, too) initially at its October meeting, but the views of Members, whether at the November AGM or otherwise, will be most welcome.

MBA

As many of you will know, Cairngorm Club member Peter Aikman spends a fair amount of time volunteering as Maintenance Organiser (MO) and for work-parties for the MBA. Peter is currently MO for the Schoolhouse bothy. During 2015 work has been carried out on almost half of the bothies maintained by the MBA. These activities can be over a weekend, be week-long or sometimes just an MO going to his allocated bothy to give it a general tidy and to remove any build-up of rubbish.

This year week-long work parties have been held at the new Camasunary bothy and at Glen Coul. The popular Gelder Shiel had a new stove fitted and insulation and recladding of the interior completed. At Faindouran the work was aided by the permission of the land-owner to drive materials the 14 miles from the public road, and over several weekends the fallen masonry gable was replaced. Callater Stable was also upgraded.

At Peter's own bothy, which is on the Cape Wrath Trail, he spent time treating the timber for woodworm and more importantly carried out the Autumn Inspection that is done at all bothies before the following year's plans are made.

While bothy workers do have fun, they are often exposed to bad weather. This year at Glencoul their tents were flattened at the start, and then they were "marooned" at the end.

A 50-Year Celebration book has been published and brings the MBA's work to the public's notice. This has culminated in the MBA being awarded a "Queen's Award for Voluntary Service". They are quietly quite proud of this award.

Snow Patches, August 2015

Provisional results from the annual late-August survey, organised by Iain Cameron and Adam Watson, of the number of snow patches in Scotland include the following (re-grouped): Southern (Ben Lui etc.) 17, Black Mount/Glen Coe 35; Ben Nevis to Grey Corries 163 (the Ben alone 58), Central (Ben Alder, Creag Meaghaidh, etc.) 89, Cairngorms 158 (Cairn Toul/Braeriach 55; Macdhuil/Cairngorm 32, Lochnagar 11), Shiel/Cluanie 47, Glen Affric to Fannichs 140, Northern 29. These are high numbers; a full analysis is expected in the scientific press in due course.
