

The NTS has issued "initial responses" to issues raised at its September public meeting in Braemar, where the Club was represented (see October Newsletter, p.5). Main points of interest include:


- Deer numbers have been reduced to target (1650); the effects will take at least 5 years to show up, but the 5 keepers can now focus on grouse habitat at the west and south of the estate
- There are no plans to remove further tracks (as on Beinn a'Bhuird) before 2011.
- Finding "a positive use" for Derry Lodge will be "one of the principal objectives of the plan".
- "In the ... next 5 years, there are no plans to remove any bridges within the core area" (e.g. at Corrour).

It is hoped that a copy of the full paper will be made available for the Club's website, and indeed the Plan itself, once finalised.



Former Republic of Yugoslavia

Anyone looking for somewhere new to climb or walk (winter or summer) might do worse than parts of the Former Republic of Yugoslavia (FRY), e.g. Slovenia (now in the EU, and probably getting as pricey as say Italy) or Montenegro (considering separation from Serbia, and fairly wild i.e. cheap, but not unsafe like Kosovo, Bosnia, etc.). Much seems like the Dolomites but relatively (or largely) undeveloped.

While in Belgrade I met a keen climber who directed me to the website of his club "Dr Rastko" Stojanovic" - http://www.aob.org.yu: have a look under Galerija (unless your Serbian is up to the rest of the site) where there are 21 slideshows (Garry, eat your heart out?) to be viewed. Most are winter pics, but it looks good for summer too, and Lydia and I had a good trip up Triglav (highest point in Slovenia) about 25 years ago.

I would be happy to put anyone interested in touch with my Belgrade contact, who could probably find a local student-type guide if wanted for a week or two. Even in Belgrade, things are pretty cheap: other than Slovenia (capital = Liubliana), local costs are minimal compared with getting there. If direct flights to Belgrade seem pricey, a minibus can be organised from Budapest airport (on the budget airline network by now) down to Belgrade at least.


