

## Hazlehead Academy Climbing Wall (Update)

Since the article in the last Newsletter, good progress has been made at Hazlehead Academy with upgrading their climbing wall. As well as our donation, the pupils wrote to a number of local companies and they have received donations from Bond Helicopters and BAA. They are now only a few pounds short of the initial target of £2500. Work will be able to be started on Phase 1, a new traverse wall, very shortly. This will give more pupils access to climbing at the Academy and since the quotation for this is £1800, they are going to continue their efforts to upgrade the existing wall as well, which will cost around another £2200 on top of what they have already raised.

Their equipment appeal is ongoing, and donations of climbing and/or walking gear will be welcomed.

The Academy winter skills day in Glen Shee was enabled by generous donations of boots, waterproofs, axes and crampons, and the entire Bronze DofE section (around 24 pupils) have been kitted out with hardly any need to hire equipment. They have also built up a significant library of mountaineering books which pupils are finding useful and informative as they accumulate knowledge and experience. Equipment unsuitable for the pupils has been successfully sold on, and, following a particularly generous donation of technical equipment, there is a "For Sale" list, which is hoped will bring in some more funds to help them reach their new target.

#### Macdhui Horizons

June 2010

Wendy Welding of the Suie Hotel in Kincraig near Kingussie has been in touch about a coloured diagram "Ben Muich Dhui section 1 from south to west 0 to 90 degrees: Outlined by Alex. Copland, the Cairngorm Club Aberdeen".

This seems to have been issued with Vol. II, no. 8 (Jan. 1897) of the Cairngorm Club Journal, which contains a 13-page article of an ascent to, and a description and list of summits seen from, the Macdhui summit. Four later CCJ articles describe (sometimes just list) the other quadrants, and may have included similar diagrams: does anyone have these, or know about them?

Copland was a founding member and first Chairman of the Cairngorm Club, but had been a hillwalker since at least 1857, i.e. a very early example of the recreational species.

He wrote articles about hill-walking in the Aberdeen Press & Journal, and latterly in the CCJ. His last recorded appearance was in 1912, when, with a "breezy little speech", he closed the proceedings which opened the Cairngorm Club footbridge (which still stands) over the Allt-na-Beinne Moire burn in Rothiemurchus.

He died in in August 1912. During the First World War, an indicator on the summit of Ben Macdhui was proposed in his memory, but it was not until 1925 that this was actually erected under the supervision of James A. Parker who had previously overseen the equivalent on Lochnagar, and who relied on Copland's drawings.

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### Muir - Break-in, Telephony, Greenery, Water etc.

In late January, during the snowy weather, the window between the kitchen and the meter cupboard at Muir was broken and entry effected by person or persons unknown. Nothing was apparently damaged (apart from the window) or stolen, and the affair - the first of its kind at Muir as far as is known - remains a mystery.

As regards questions raised at recent AGMs and elsewhere:

- Improved telephony at Muir for emergencies and textophiles has been investigated; a booster in the roof space might do the trick, but at least one network (Vodafone) certainly gets through to Muir in some parts of the grounds and it is understood that this is enough to allow emergency calls to be made even on phones on another network.
- The stove may not be very 'green' but is a central feature of the main room; however, it is showing its age, and a replacement is being considered.
- The water system was prone to packing up during the early spring; the problem was thought for long to be related to the sub-zero temperatures which prevailed for so long but eventually traced to a very fine sediment bunging up the UV filter.

The ex-SYHA hostel along the way has been taken over by the Aberdeen Wing of the Air Training Corps; the Club has agreed terms for them to have continued use of the shared water supply.

#### **Weekend Meets Update**
